- 成功舉辦『聯大互聯網科技博覽 2003』,以提高新一代互聯網人員的專業水平
- 積極為政府與各社區團體擔任諮詢委員及為資訊科技政策提供意見
- 舉行共28個免費『提升個人能力工作坊』以增加會員的個人競爭能力及
- 為向大眾推廣資訊及通訊科技,本會特意於27間公共圖書館舉辦了共28個互聯網講座

The year 2003 was a year of challenges for Hong Kong. It was a time of economic downturn, and the community was shaken by the outbreak of SARS in March. We are pleased to report that iProA was able to mobilized its own as well as its network of resources to contribute to the fight against SARS, while the Association has continued to grow and develop with success despite the adversity.

More than 100 new members have joined iProA over the past year. iProA now represents 532 professionals, including 112 voting members. Starting from 2004, voting members of iProA with 4 years of IT experience are eligible voters of the IT Functional Constituency of Legco.

In the past year, iProA was operating under the leadership of 18-Members of Council and through operate through the 18 working committees and special interest groups (SIGs) of our Executive Committee, which consists of 42 volunteer members, consisting of 42 volunteer Executive Committee Members and 3 full time staff members.

2003 Major Events

Major achievements of the Association in the year 2003 include:

- * Contributed to the fight against SARS through initiation of the "BrightenHK Campaign", organized the 'IT in Health Forum', and participated in the 'Net Care Campaign'
- * Successfully applied for the eligibility of our members as voters of the IT Constituency in the Legislative Council elections
- * Contributed to the building of a digitally inclusive information society and bridging digital divide through constructive direct actions through the Web Care Campaign, and founded the 'Global Alliance for Bridging the Digital Divide' (GABDD) with participation from 22 countries
- * Participated in the United Nations' World Summit of the Information Society (WSIS) and World Summit Award (WSA)
- * Raised the standard of excellence of the new generation Internet professionals by successfully launched the Intervarsity Internet Technologies Exposition and Conference 2003 (IITEC 2003)
- * Actively participated in governmental and community advisory bodies and contributed in the shaping of ICT (Information and Communication Technologies) related policies in Hong Kong
- * Enhanced personal competitiveness of members by successfully organized 28 free 'Self-Enhancement Workshops' and
- * Promoted ICT usage and knowledge to the general public via organization of 28 IT Talks in 27 public libraries
